**Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED**

Widener Memorial will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

*During the Spring Title I meeting, parents will be invited to meet with staff and provide feedback to parental engagement activities and developing the parent and family engagement policy and school-parent compact.  
On April 27, 2023 the principal met with Parents of Widener Students and with the school team to develop this year's Parental and Family Engagement Policy and the School Parent Compact. Parents also had the opportunity to discuss the existing budget and the 1% set-aside for parent involvement.

*The Annual Title I meeting is held each year during Back to School Night. It will be held again in the Fall. Parents will be informed about the State's academic content standards, student academic achievement standards, local academic assessments including alternate assessments, the requirements of Title I-Part A, and how to work with educators and monitor student progress. In addition, parents will have an opportunity to monitor their child's progress during Parent-Teacher Conferences, SAC Meetings, and through LEA's explanations during IEP meetings. Parents will be given timely information about Title I program through weekly communication folders, school newsletter and Home and School meetings.*


